Job Title: Mentor

Job Description:

Provide one-on-one mentoring to kids, ages 11-17. Participate in arts and cultural activities, sports and recreation, and educational enrichment with your mentee, one time week, during Y.O.U.'s out-of-school time program or at our Saturday Morning Breakfast Club.

Eligibility Requirements:

High School Diploma, or higher degree preferred. Ability to make a long-term commitment to the project (minimum of eighteen months). Should have a desire to make a positive difference in the lives of youth.

Responsibilities:

The Mentor is responsible for creating a positive relationship with their assigned mentee and to meet with their mentee on a regular basis. Specific responsibilities include:

- Develop a healthy, positive, relationship with a mentee lasting at least eighteen (18) months.
- Meet weekly with youth during structured out-of-school time program (After School, Evenings, and/or Saturday mornings)
- Assist with homework and/or participate in activities with youth during program time.
- Be a positive role model to mentee.
- Attend at least one (1) special field trip activity with mentee each quarter.
- Attend at least one (1) Family Night each quarter and work toward developing positive interactions with parents of mentee.
- Attend and participate in all training events, team meetings, and regular supervision.
- Maintain good relationships with program staff and other mentors within the program.
- Assist program staff with data collection and evaluation as needed.
